Opinion and Award

The grievance sets forth the names of twenty-two employees who filled vacancies on extended operations in the 44" Hot Strip Mill on at least 30 turns and were listed by the Company, accordingly, as having attained sequential seniority on a permanent basis as Mill Labor Piler Labor. A correction of the list in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement is sought.

The principles governing the question of the acquisition of sequential standing by virtue of 30 turns worked on extended operations in situations such as that presented in this case were decided in Arbitration Nos. 167, 178, and 179. Those principles control this case.

In view of the extensive consideration given the problem presented by this case in the other cases cited above, a hearing was waived by the parties.

## AWARD

The grievance is sustained, in accordance with the opinion and ruling in Arbitration No. 167.
