Sisters and Brothers.

First, I would like to encourage everyone, who has not yet voted, to exercise their right to **VOTE on November 3!** 

According to management, the sale of ArcelorMittal USA facilities to Cleveland Cliffs has been forwarded to the Justice Department. The Justice Department will review the sale as it compares to the ant-trust laws. We expect a favorable decision from the Justice Department by the end of November. If all goes as expected, the sale of ArcelorMittal USA facilities to Cleveland Cliffs should be finalized before Christmas!

Management also stated that they will resume testing, interviews and hiring relatives form the current applicant pool. The target new hire number is 120 before the end of 2020 and another 130 or so during the first quarter of 2021. Also, (stay tuned for the actual date) this December management will begin to accept applications through WORKONE. As soon as we get the actual date when applications will be accepted again, we will get the date out to everyone.

Yesterday, Indiana set a daily high of newly reported cases of COVID-19! Unfortunately, the number of hospitalizations and new infections (3,649) across the state have continued to spike. Indiana's daily update shows 1,733 Hoosiers are currently hospitalized with the coronavirus, the highest since early April. Of those, 509 are in intensive care, which is the most since May 6. Such hospitalizations have grown by more than 72% since Sept. 22, 2020. More than 70% of Indiana's ICU beds are also in use, according to the health department, leaving 565 beds available as of Thursday. Now, more of Indiana's ICU beds are filled than at any other point in the pandemic so far. The data continued to be bleak yesterday with Indiana's 33 newly recorded COVID-19 deaths raising the state's pandemic death toll to 4,260, including confirmed and presumed coronavirus infections. To date, more than 1.6 million people have been tested for COVID-19 in Indiana, and a total of 172,730 Hoosiers are known to have had the virus.

These are the facts indicating that we must stay the course of keeping our hands cleaned, maintaining 6' or more of social distancing, and utilizing mask or face covering. All of these actions can help prevent and/or slowdown the spread of this terrible pandemic.

It is for our well-being that we follow in plant recommendations on hand cleanliness, surface cleaning, social distancing, wearing of masks, and daily self-monitoring. We can only benefit from following these safe practices at home, in public and at work. We are all affected by the health and wellbeing of each other. Let's do our best to support each other and our families by adhering to CDC recommendations regarding the prevention of spreading COVID-19! We have all heard the horror stories of friends, relatives and yes, our retirees that have died as a result of the Covid-19 Virus. Together, we can minimize the chances of us being added to the list of those stricken with Covid-19.

According to management, the operations will remain at about the same level of operations with a few exceptions as noted below:

- Our Riverdale Facility will continue production.
- At Indiana Harbor East (IHE), overall operations will maintain production levels. According to IHE Management this includes, 80" Hot Strip, #4 Steel Production, #3 Cold Strip facilities 80" Tandem, #5 Pickle Line and the 29 Temper Mill.
- # 3 CAL line should restart on Tuesday or Wednesday following their annual outage. Also, #4 Steel Production has a one day outage scheduled on November 4.
